Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway Annual Report 2023/2024

Introduction

The Kokoda Track Memorial Walkway (KTMW) at Concord West, NSW serves as a poignant reminder of the bravery, sacrifice and enduring legacy of Australian soldiers who fought on the Kokoda Track during World War II. Our mission is to honour their memory, educate the public and foster a sense of appreciation and respect for our veterans and their families

Key Achievements

1. Commemorative Services

Three main services for ANZAC Day, Victory in Pacific and Kokoda Day were held with record attendances of over 350 participants for each event, including veterans, families, and local community members. Distinguished guests included government officials from State and Federal Parliaments and representatives from veteran organisations and the Diplomatic Corp. This year has also seen an increase in school students attending from across NSW. Keynote speakers were current serving members of the Army, Navy and Air Force.

2. Educational Programs for Schools and Community

- School Tours: Over 50 school groups visited the Walkway, coming from as far as Port Macquarie, and were provided with guided tours by our dedicated band of volunteers. These tours emphasised the historical significance of the Kokoda Campaign and the values of courage, endurance, mateship, and sacrifice. Students were given the opportunity to have an immersive experience during their visit, using the virtual reality technology offered at the Ralph Honner Education Centre.
- o **Tours for Community Groups:** These tours have proved to be popular with a wide range of community groups including walking groups, Rotary, RSL subbranches, aged care facilities, sporting groups and Probus networks.
- o **Friends of Kokoda 'Beyond the Battlefield' talks:** The talk series (held at the Ralph Honner Education Centre) has gained momentum, with five events held over this financial year. Feedback has been extremely positive on the speakers and the topics presented. We are grateful to the historians who have participated in the talks. Future promotions will focus on local community members and groups to increase attendance.









o **Installation of QR Codes:** Providing greater access to information for visitors traversing the Walkway, QR codes have since been installed on each of the 22 information stations along the Walkway for greater depth of information, linking stations to our website - www.kokodawalkway.com.au

3. Volunteer Engagement

- Our volunteer base, comprising veterans and families of veterans, continues to grow. Regular training sessions ensure our volunteers are well-equipped to conduct guided tours and participate in commemorative services. An appreciation lunch was held in December to acknowledge their invaluable contributions.
- The Memorial was pleased to have staff from the Teachers Mutual Bank and Commonwealth Bank volunteer their services over this period to help create a new garden, and to clean a total of 500 plaques in the Memorial Rose Garden, respectively. Members from the nearby Rhodes Chinese Community assisted with planting over 3,000 poppies for Kokoda Day, creating a remarkable sight leading up to, and on, the day.

4. Site Improvements

- Maintenance and Upgrades: Several maintenance projects were completed during this period, including pathway repairs and landscaping enhancements. Structural fortification to the granite wall of the Memorial's Centrepiece was undertaken including the replacement of floor tiles and waterproofing membrane. The installation of a new pump has improved the flow of water to th Centrepiece via its reticulated system from creek bed and has resulted in the enhanced aesthetics of the area.
- Accessibility: The Memorial continues to ensure accessibility to its facilities for all visitors, ensuring that the Walkway is inclusive and welcoming to everyone. This includes a friendly wheelchair gradient along the Walkway and the availability of disabled toilets.

5. Community Engagement

• Events and Partnerships

- o The Memorial has continued to collaborate with local organisations and businesses to host community events, raising awareness and fostering a sense of community around the Walkway. The NSW Swifts netball team and the Sydney Thunder Cricket team visited the Memorial and met with our veterans to receive extra inspiration and to learn about leadership and resilience.
- Following the visit, we were pleased to have the full Swifts team attend our ANZAC Service in April of this year.
- NSW Police Legacy conducted their visit to the Memorial once again to launch their annual Trek over the Owen Stanley ranges in PNG. The young trekkers had the opportunity to meet our veteran guides.
- We were proud to be a leader in the field by conducting talks on the history of the Memorial and its significance in Mandarin to the growing number of non-English speaking residents in nearby Rhodes as away of engaging our multicultural community, and to foster greater understanding. The talks will be repeated in the new fiscal year.

Communication

- Newsletters: The Memorial continues to produce three newsletters annually to keep the community, stakeholders and our Friends of Kokoda informed of happenings at the Memorial. Newsletters are also available on our website
- Website: Improvements have been gained through a refurbished website which now enables donations, e-commerce, and bookings of facilities to be made online resulting in greater efficiencies. The website is continually updated, and is a valuable tool providing details on upcoming events and is also an educational resource with numerous Kokoda-related articles, publications and links.


Memorandum of Understanding (MOU)

This year the KTMW signed a MOU with the PNG Minister of Tourism. This MOU will facilitate the PNG Government funding a cultural dance group to attend Kokoda Day at the KTMW on 3 November each year.

Financial Overview

Our longer-term financial position remains unpredictable due to government funding grants. This year we were thankful for generous support from our sponsors, the Commonwealth Department of Veterans' Affairs, NSW Government, NSW RSL and sub-branches, and the community. Key financial highlights include:

- **Donations:** An increase in community donations and sponsorships have allowed KTMW to fund critical projects and initiatives.
- **Grants:** Successful grant applications provided additional resources for the schools' programs and site improvements.
- **Expenditure:** Funds were prudently managed, with expenditures focused on site maintenance, commemorations, operational costs, and volunteer support.
